# Chair Update – Roads & Safety

**Council actions outstanding - Crawforddyke Primary School Road Safety** - email sent to follow up on the below actions, still waiting to hear back, given the current situation and SLC concentrating on other issues - **LM to follow up again.** 

Mandatory 20mph speed limit now in place – with additional road makings implemented.

Measure	Progress	Timescale
Traffic Calming / speed limit proposals for Glenafeoch Road	Due to the recorded vehicle speeds, consideration was being given to replacing the existing give way junction controls at Parkandarroch Crescent and Angus Road with mini-roundabouts. This will reduce traffic speeds as drivers on all approaches to the junctions will be required to slow down and be prepared to give way to traffic.  Should this be implemented, a further speed survey will be undertaken once the roundabouts are in place and if vehicle speeds are reduced sufficiently a part-time 20mph speed limit will be introduced on Glenafeoch Road. In the event of speeds not being reduced, other measures such as horizontal traffic calming (road narrowing/priority vehicles) will also be considered. 

Caroline and Mary have been working hard to organise and set up the treasure hunt.



### **GROWTH MINDSET MANTRA FOR MAY: I'VE GOT THIS!**

"The path to growth mindset is a journey, not a proclamation."



This is the final "monthly mantra" we have been sharing with our pupils, the final "words of wisdom" we will impart and the final activity we can all challenge them with.

We are talking about talking! Self-talking to be exact. Children need to understand the difference between the fixed mindset messages and the growth mindset messages they hear, so they can re-frame them and go on to overcome the challenges they face. For example, instead of saying, "I don't get this!" they could try saving "Can I look at this another way?"

Carol Dweck suggests that making a plan and visualising how you will carry it out will help you use the growth mindset when faced with failure and struggle, bad situations that can easily knock you off course when or if you let them. Make a plan with your child to help them learn or overcome something this summer! Perhaps learning to swim or ride their bike, or even to get through 3 books! Anything is

As we reach the end this session and the work with our learners, it is important to recognise 2 key

- Everyone has a fixed mindset and a growth mindset: this has never been about 'getting rid' of the fixed mindset as that would be impossible! Fixed mindsets will always be there. What we have hopefully begun to do this year is give learners the tools they need to use their growth mindset to
- This has never been a competition: students have not been competing with each other to see who has the best growth mindset. Hopefully this year has been more about recognising personal achievements and growth and giving praise where it is due!
